Clothing

Absences

There has recently been a change to the statutory requirements regarding absences. Please make sure that if your child is going to be absent that you let us know on the day of each absence, in line with our policies by 9.30a.m. However, if you have already given us notice prior to a day off or holiday, then you do not need to let us know each day.

Invoices

A gentle reminder for invoices to be paid within 10 days of receipt. Failure to do this could mean that your child will not be able to access any additional hours and will only be able to attend their government-funded sessions. However, if you need to discuss your invoice with a member of the team, please speak to Mel, Vicki, or Linda, our chairperson, in confidence.

Illness

As the weather is getting colder, it is the time for illness. Please keep your children off if they are not feeling well. This will help to stop the spread of germs to other children and staff. We also have a 48-hour sickness policy. Can we also encourage children to cough into their elbows rather than their hands to stop the spread of germs.

Toys from Home

As a team, we are aware that children like to show their peers some of their toys from home. We do allow this within the setting; we just ask that the toys are safe and age-appropriate. However, please be aware that these toys are also at risk of getting lost or broken in the setting. Children will also be encouraged to share their toys from home at preschool; therefore, they might need to have this explained before arrival.

Bodiam bonfire is at the castle pub on the 14th November. The Bonfire will be lit at 6 pm. We will be running a stall with Bodiam School PTA. Any proceeds will be split between both the school and the preschool, so please stop by if you are there.


We would also like to thank the wonderful parent who made the communication and cookery bags. These are lovely, and we really appreciate the effort and time you took to make them.
